



Virtual Sessions

Virtual Sessions are on-demand learning experiences designed specifically for asynchronous viewing. These sessions provide focused, evidence-informed content that attendees can access anytime and anywhere.

Unlike in-person sessions, virtual sessions are intended for topics that can be effectively delivered through self-paced learning and do not require live discussion, hands-on practice, or collaborative activities.

All Virtual Sessions should incorporate strategies that actively engage learners in an asynchronous environment. Engagement may include reflection prompts, self-assessment questions, case-based application, demonstrations, or other techniques that promote active learning and knowledge application.

Format:

- 30 - 60 minutes
- Designed specifically for on-demand, asynchronous viewing
- Recorded in advance for inclusion in the convention's on-demand library

Virtual Sessions are ideal for:

- Research updates and findings
- Emerging evidence and best practices
- Foundational and refresher content
- Professional development topics
- Case studies and lessons learned
- Technology demonstrations
- Topics that benefit from flexible, self-paced learning

What Makes a Strong Virtual Session?

Successful proposals typically:

- Address a relevant educational need
- Deliver focused, evidence-informed content
- Utilize visuals, examples, and storytelling to maintain engagement
- Are intentionally designed for asynchronous viewing
- Include practical applications attendees can implement in practice
- Clearly articulate key takeaways and learning outcomes

Attendees should leave the session with practical knowledge, strategies, or resources they can immediately apply in their professional practice.

Virtual Sessions should be designed specifically for on-demand delivery and will not be recordings of live conference presentations.

Presenter Guidelines:

- Up to two presenters
- Both presenters should contribute to content development and delivery
